Service of Light

- L Jesus Christ is the Light of the world,
- **G** the light no darkness can overcome.
- L Stay with us, Lord, for it is evening,
- **G** and the day is almost over.
- Let your light scatter the darkness,
- **G** and illumine your Church.

As the hymn is said, the candles on and near the altar are lighted. When the large candle is used, the candles are lighted from its flame.

- L Joyous light of glory:
- of the immortal Father; heavenly, holy, blessed Jesus Christ.
 We have come to the setting of the sun, and we look to the evening light.
 We sing to God, the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit:
 You are worthy of being praised with pure voices forever.
 O Son of God, O Giver of life: The universe proclaims your glory.

The thanksgiving concludes the Service of Light.

- **G** It is right to give him thanks and praise.
- Blessed are you, O Lord our God, king of the universe, who led your people Israel by a pillar of cloud by day and a pillar of fire by night:

 May his Word be a lamp to our feet and a light to our path; for you are merciful, and you love your whole creation, and we, your creatures, glorify you, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Psalmody

The Psalmody begins with this song for forgiveness and protection.

 Let my prayer rise before you as incense; the lifting up of my hands as the evening sacrifice.

O Lord, I call to you; come to me quickly; hear my voice when I cry to you.

Let my prayer rise before you as incense; the lifting up of my hands as the evening sacrifice.

Set a watch before my mouth, O Lord, and guard the door of my lips. Let not my heart incline to any evil thing; let me not be occupied in wickedness with evildoers.

But my eyes are turned to you, Lord God; in you I take refuge. Strip me not of my life.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be forever. Amen.

Let my prayer rise before you as incense; the lifting up of my hands as the evening sacrifice.

Silence for meditation.

Let the incense of our repentant prayer ascend before you, O Lord, and let your lovingkindness descend upon us, that with purified minds we may sing your praises with the Church on earth and the whole heavenly host, and may glorify you forever and ever.

A second psalm is said. This Psalm 51 is to be reflected upon later in this service. Silence for meditation follows each psalm or canticle.

Psalm 51, LBW

¹Have mercy on me, O God, according to your lovingkindness;

in your great compassion blot out my offenses.

²Wash me through and through from my wickedness, and cleanse me from my sin.

³For I know my transgressions, and my sin is ever before me. ⁴Against you only have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight. ⁵And so you are justified when you speak and upright in your judgment. Indeed, I have been wicked from my birth, a sinner from my mother's womb. ⁷For behold, you look for truth deep within me, and will make me understand wisdom secretly. ⁸Purge me from my sin, and I shall be pure; wash me, and I shall be clean indeed. ⁹Make me hear of joy and gladness, that the body you have broken may rejoice. ¹⁰Hide your face from my sins, and blot out all my iniquities. ¹¹Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me. ¹²Cast me not away from your presence, and take not your Holy Spirit from me. ¹³Give me the joy of your saving help again and sustain me with your bountiful Spirit. ¹⁴I shall teach your ways to the wicked, and sinners shall return to you. ¹⁵Deliver me from death, O God, and my tongue shall sing of your righteousness, O God of my salvation. ¹⁶Open my lips, O Lord, and my mouth shall proclaim your praise. ¹⁷Had you desired it, I would have offered sacrifice, but you take no delight in burnt-offerings. ¹⁸The sacrifice of God is a troubled spirit; a broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not despise. ¹⁹Be favorable and gracious to Zion, and rebuild the walls of Jerusalem.

²⁰Then you will be pleased with the appointed sacrifices, with burnt-offerings and oblations;

then shall they offer young bullocks upon your altar.

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The psalm prayer appropriate to each psalm follows the silence. PSALM PRAYER

- L Almighty and merciful Father, you freely forgive those who, as David of old, acknowledge and confess their sins. Create in us pure hearts, and wash away all our sins in the blood of your dear Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

Lessons

One or two lessons are read.

GOSPEL LESSON FOR THE DAY......John 2:23–3:15, RSV ^{2:23}Now when he was in Jerusalem at the Passover feast, many believed in his name when they saw the signs which he did; ²⁴but Jesus did not trust himself to them, ²⁵because he knew all men and needed no one to bear witness of man; for he himself knew what was in man.

^{3:1}Now there was a man of the Pharisees, named Nicode'mus, a ruler of the Jews. ²This man came to Jesus by night and said to him, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher come from God; for no one can do these signs that you do, unless God is with him." 3Jesus answered him, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born anew, he cannot see the kingdom of God." 4Nicode'mus said to him, "How can a man be born when he is old? Can he enter a second time into his mother's womb and be born?" ⁵Jesus answered, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God. 6That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit. ⁷Do not marvel that I said to you, 'You must be born anew.' ⁸The wind blows where it wills, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know whence it comes or whither it goes; so it is with every one who is born of the Spirit." ⁹Nicode'mus said to him, "How can this be?" ¹⁰Jesus answered him, "Are you a teacher of Israel, and yet you do not understand this? ¹¹Truly, truly, I say to you, we speak of what we know, and bear witness to what we have seen; but you do not receive our testimony. ¹²If I have told you earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you heavenly things? ¹³No one has ascended into heaven but he who descended from heaven, the Son of man. ¹⁴And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of man be lifted up, ¹⁵that whoever believes in him may have eternal life."

Silence for meditation follows each reading. The leader then continues:

In many and various ways God spoke to his people of old by the prophets.
 But now in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son.

GOSPEL CANTICLE

My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord; my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for he has looked with favor on his lowly servant. From this day all generations will call me blessed.

The Almighty has done great things for me, and holy is his name. He has mercy on those who fear him in every generation. He has shown the strength of his arm; he has scattered the proud in their conceit. He has cast down the mighty from their thrones, and has lifted up the lowly.

He has filled the hungry with good things, and the rich he has sent away empty. He has come to the help of his servant Israel, for he has remembered his promise of mercy, the promise he made to our fathers, to Abraham and his children forever.

L Rejoicing in the fellowship of all the saints, let us commend ourselves, one another, and our whole life to Christ, our Lord.

G To you, O Lord.

O God, from whom come all holy desires, all good counsels, and all just works: Give to us, your servants, that peace which the world cannot give, that our hearts may be set to obey your commandments; and also that we, being defended from the fear of our enemies, may live in peace and quietness; through the merits of Jesus Christ our Savior, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, God forever.
