Preface for Funerals

■ It is indeed right and salutary that we should at all times and in all places offer thanks and praise, O Lord, almighty and ever-living God. In Christ who rose from the dead our hope of resurrection dawned. The sting of death has been removed by the glorious promise of his risen life. And so with the church on earth and the hosts of heaven, we praise your name and join their unending hymn:

Sanctus:

 Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of pow'r and might: Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna. Hosanna. Hosanna in the highest.
 Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

A Eucharistic Prayer for Funerals

P You are indeed holy, O God. With all your saints we give you thanks and praise: For your creative goodness that brings forth life, for your sustaining goodness that surrounds us in every day, and for your redemptive goodness that brings forth love which never fails.

You called as your own the descendants of Abraham and Sarah, embracing them with your faithfulness. You have called us as your own through your beloved Son, Jesus Christ, in the life-giving waters of Baptism.

We praise you for his life and his proclamation of the Kingdom, and for his faithfulness as he stretched out His arms on the cross to open wide the gates of His heavenly reign.

As we gather at this table, we ask you: Send your life-giving Spirit upon this bread and wine, that they may be for us the sustaining food of heaven, the body and blood of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

In the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me. Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.

For as often as we eat of this bread and drink from this cup we proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

G Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

P Gracious Father, we rejoice in our Lord's promise of preparing a place for us. We await the fulfillment of that promise: When death shall be swallowed up in victory and every tear shall be wiped away.

G Amen. Come, Lord Jesus.

▶ We now rejoice as we remember before you that wondrous cloud of witnesses and ancestors who relied on your faithfulness, and who now abide in the peace of Christ – especially your servant, Emma. As you nourish us with this Bread of Life and this Cup of Salvation, turn our mourning into dancing and our sorrow into joy as we anticipate that final and great reunion with all whom we have loved.

G Through him, with him, in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory is yours, almighty Father, now and forever. Amen

DISTRIBUTION OF HOLY COMMUNION

+ Holy Communion is offered to all baptized Christians who continue in the faith of the Church. If you would like to receive the Eucharistic Wine, please receive the small glass by the top edge, trying not to touch the minister's fingers. After communing, place the small glass on the tray, upright if possible.

+ If you should desire to pray quietly before or while receiving the Holy Sacrament, as many Christians do, here is one of Luther's prayers for that purpose:

Lord, it is true that I am not worthy that you should come under my roof. Yet I am in need and desire your help and grace. So I come with no other plea except that I have heard the gracious invitation to come to your altar. I am unworthy, but you have assured me I shall have forgiveness of all sins through your body and blood which I eat and drink in this sacrament. Amen, dear Lord; your Word is true. I do not doubt it. Let happen to me whatever you say. Amen.

+ If you should desire to pray quietly after receiving the Holy Communion, here is a possible such prayer. It is based on a prayer of St. Basil the Great (329-379):

O Master, Christ our God: I thank you for all the good things which you have bestowed upon me, and for this partaking of your life-giving Sacrament. And I pray: keep me, my loved ones, and this congregation under your protection, and in the shadow of your wings. For you are the Bread of Life, the Fountain of holiness, the Giver of good things, and unto you we ascribe glory: to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit: now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.
