FIRST LESSON Isaiah 65:1-9, NRSV

The prophet announces the LORD's impatience. The people's self absorption is idolatry, and images from pagan worship fill this reading. Like a vintner who crushes the grape to release the wine, the LORD will use Israel's exile to establish a new community of the faithful.


SECOND LESSON Galatians 3:23-29, KJV
For Saint Paul, baptism is a powerful bond that unites people not only with God but with other believers. Those who call themselves children of God are called to a transformation that removes prejudices of race, social class, or gender in favor of true unity in Christ.

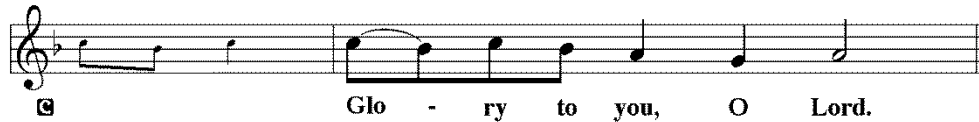

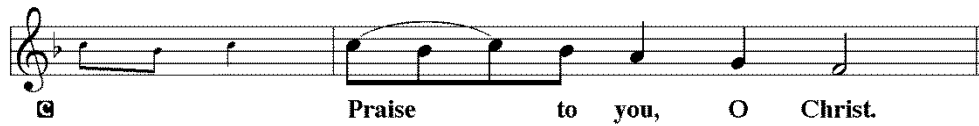

And he went away, proclaiming throughout the whole city how much Jesus had done for him.
