
were born, "as many as the stars of heaven and as the innumerable grains of sand by the seashore."

¹³All of these died in faith without having received the promises, but from a distance they saw and greeted them. They confessed that they were strangers and foreigners on the earth, ¹⁴for people who speak in this way make it clear that they are seeking a homeland. ¹⁵If they had been thinking of the land that they had left behind, they would have had opportunity to return. ¹⁶But as it is, they desire a better country, that is, a heavenly one. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God; indeed, he has prepared a city for them.





- P Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God? Hillary and Scott, Parrish and Ken: I renounce them.
- P Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God? Hillary and Scott, Parrish and Ken: I renounce them.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

P Do you turn to Christ as your Lord and Savior? Hillary and Scott, Parrish and Ken: I do.

Stand. The presiding minister addresses the assembly:

- P With the whole church, let us confess our faith.
- **P** Do you believe in God the Father?
- **Q** I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.
- P Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?
- I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.
- P Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?
- **G** I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

PRAYER FOR REED

- P Let us pray for Reed who is receiving the Sacrament of new birth.
- P Deliver Reed, O Lord, from the way of sin and death.

THANKSGIVING AND BLESSING OF WATER

During the Thanksgiving of the water, several gestures are made which help illustrate the meaning of Baptism. The water is divided with the sign of the cross at the mention of the Trinitarian name, and a small quantity is poured out from each quadrant remembering that we are commanded to go to all nations to baptize. Recalling the Spirit's hovering over the waters at creation, the presiding minister blows on the water forming the sign of the cross at the invocation of the Holy Spirit.

- **P** The Lord be with you.
- And also with you.
- **P** Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
- **Q** It is right to give him thanks and praise.
- P Holy God, mighty Lord, gracious Father: We give you thanks, for in the beginning your Spirit moved over the waters and you created heaven and earth. By the gift of water you nourish and sustain us and all living things. By the waters of the flood you condemned the wicked and saved those whom you had chosen, Noah and his family. You led Israel by the pillar of cloud and fire through the sea, out of slavery into the freedom of the promised land. In the waters of the Jordan your Son was baptized by John and anointed with the Spirit. By the baptism of his own death and resurrection your beloved Son has set us free from the bondage to sin and death, and has opened the way to the joy and freedom of everlasting life. He made water a sign of the kingdom and of cleansing and rebirth. In obedience to his command, we make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of + the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. (The Minister divides the waters with the sign of the Cross.)

(Invocation) Pour out your Holy Spirit, so that Reed who is here baptized may be given new life. Wash away the sin of all those who are cleansed by this water and bring them forth as a inheritors of your glorious kingdom. To you be given praise and honor and worship through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever. Amen.

HOLY BAPTISM

P Reed Montgomery, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the + Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

LAYING ON OF HANDS AND PRAYER FOR THE SPIRIT

P God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, we give you thanks for freeing your sons and daughters from the power of sin and for raising them up to a new life through this holy sacrament. Pour your Holy Spirit upon Reed: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence. Amen.

ANOINTING AND SIGN OF THE CROSS

P Reed, child of God, you have been sealed with the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever.

SALT

P Remember the words of the Lord Jesus to his disciples: "You are the salt of the earth."

Reed, receive the salt, symbol of wisdom, creature of God for the preservation of the creatures of God. May you be preserved to the day of Christ's coming.

BAPTISMAL CANDLE

P Remember the words of the Lord Jesus to his disciples: "You are the light of the world."

Reed, receive this burning light, and when our Lord Jesus shall come to claim his own, may you greet him with all the saints and live under him in his kingdom forever and ever.

SCRIPTURE

P Remember the words of St. Peter: You are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, that you may declare the wonderful deeds of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light.

WELCOME

- P Through Baptism God has made Reed a member of the priesthood we all share in Christ Jesus, that we may proclaim the praise of God and bear his creative and redeeming Word to all the world.





Preface for Sundays after Pentecost

P It is indeed right and salutary that we should at all times and in all places offer thanks and praise to you, O Lord, holy Father, through Christ our Lord; who on this day overcame death and the grave, and by his glorious resurrection opened to us the way of everlasting life. And so, with the Church on earth and the hosts of heaven, we praise your name and join their unending hymn:



Eucharistic Prayer III (This prayer is based on ancient models from the Liturgy of St. James, the Liturgy of St. John Chrysostom, Apostolic Constitutions, the Roman Missal, and the Liturgy of St. Basil. Its only congregational response is at the end, "Amen," which the congregation is encouraged to say loudly and boldly as the principle Amen of the service. See 1 Corinthians 14:16.)

P You are indeed holy, almighty and merciful God; you are most holy, and great is the majesty of your glory. You so loved the world that you gave your only Son, that whoever believes in him may not perish but have eternal life. Having come into the world, he fulfilled for us your holy will and accomplished our salvation.

In the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Remembering, therefore, his salutary command, his life-giving Passion and death, his glorious resurrection and ascension, and his promise to come again, we give thanks to you, Lord God Almighty, not as we ought, but as we are able; and we implore you mercifully to accept our

praise and thanksgiving, and, with your Word and Holy Spirit, to bless us, your servants, and these your own gifts of bread and wine; that we and all who share in the body and blood of your Son may be filled with heavenly peace and joy, and, receiving the forgiveness of sin, may be sanctified in soul and body, and have our portion with all your saints.

All honor and glory are yours, O God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, in your holy Church, now and forever.




